### Workshop Description-

#### The Ally in You- Advocating with the Deaf Community

The ally concept has taken hold firmly in recent years, forcing difficult and uncomfortable conversations between interpreters and consumers. Technology, including social media and micro blogging sites, that accelerated the discussion between consumers and interpreters. But one thing remains: wider, deeper, and faster cultural change might occur if Deaf consumers and interpreters collaborate.

As the sole presenter for this workshop, 2axend's founder and CEO Corey Axelrod discusses ally behaviors from the Deaf perspective and maps out opportunities for interpreters to provide proactive and strategic support that benefit the Deaf community. ### Workshop Objectives-

- Discuss common situations when powers and privileges are not acknowledged and the impact they have on marginalized populations.
- Understand how micro-aggression and tensions of power and privilege negatively impact the communication accessibility experience.
- Explore the impacts of individual and systematic biases on Deaf individuals and other marginalized populations.
- Identify ways interpreters can effectively champion Deaf-centric priorities and agendas.
